The following events have been updated to reflect changes per level (scaffolding) as submitted by state associations. These events have multiple revisions in addition to updated rubrics. Please be sure that members understand their level of competition (1, 2, 3 or 4). They are:

- Career Investigation
 - Entrepreneurship
 - Food Innovations
 - Nutrition and Wellness
 - Professional Presentation
 - Public Policy Advocate
 - Repurpose and Redesign
 - Sports Nutrition
 - Sustainability Challenge
- Baking and Pastry – a process for preliminary competition (if required) for National Leadership Conference has been established. A test is no longer part of the Point Summary Form.
 - Culinary Arts – a process for preliminary competition (if required) for National Leadership Conference has been established. A test is no longer part of the Point Summary Form.
 - Public Policy Advocate – projects must relate to an area concerning Family and Consumer Sciences and/or related occupations.
 - At the National Leadership Conference, the top 10 finalists per event/level will be recognized.

Please read event rules carefully to ensure eligibility and receive the highest possible points.
